Unfortunately, student absence has been a problem for Rosewood Downs PS in recent years. Absences at our school are higher than state and like-school benchmarks, which is really disappointing for us. It is important for parents to realise that every time school is missed, students also miss opportunities for learning. - Students are safer and better supervised at school than in many alternative settings
- People are more positive towards those that have a good attendance attitude, and finally,
- The more students attend, the more they learn and the more they will like school!

The students were able to talk about their feelings and strategies to cope with difficult situations, and enjoyed making a bravery medallion to take home.

Last year the school was able to host the Anglicare parenting course Growing Great Kids and a number of our parents attended. They found the sessions to be very informative and helpful. We are pleased to be hosting the program again this year, with the first session commencing on Friday 1st March. We would encourage all parents, grandparents and carers to attend these sessions as they will provide a valuable source of shared knowledge and expertise to help you face the challenges and embrace the rewards of parenting.
