The Department of Education & Training has a new policy for managing mild to moderate student allergies. Students with a mild or moderate allergy to a food or insects and those with a medication allergy should have an ASCIA Action Plan for Allergic Reactions (green plan). Those students with a severe reaction to allergies should have an ASCIA Action Plan for Anaphylaxis (red plan). Both of these action plans are required to be provided to the school by parents. If your child has an allergy that is already noted on our system you will be receiving a letter and proforma to complete to ensure our information is up to date and accurate. If you don't receive this and your child has an allergy please contact the school so that we can update our records.
