Impetigo (School Sores)

We have had two confirmed cases of Impetigo. It usually starts as a blister or pustule, which rapidly ruptures leaving a distinctive honey-coloured crust. There are usually multiple spots. It can occur on any part of the skin. It tends to be itchy, rather than painful and children who have it usually remain well in themselves. Impetigo most often affects children and is spread by touch: children scratching themselves spread it over their own skin and touching other children can spread it from person to person. Please note that children need to stay home until treatment with antibiotics has commenced. When children return to school; -sores on exposed surfaces must be covered with a watertight dressing.

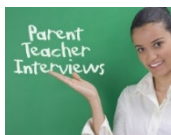
