

Another week, another bumper list of activities and events at Rosewood Downs!

Our preps had a tremendous day at the zoo on Wednesday and were very lucky to get fine weather and sunny skies. There was lots of walking to make sure they got to visit as many animals as possible and there were many highlights for both the students and teachers. The day at the zoo was a very successful first excursion for our preps. Not only does it provide an outstanding learning experience for the students, but it is also the first time that many of them have participated in a fullday outing away from parents or other family members. This is a really important achievement for our prep children and a successful day out without parental accompaniment and influence does wonders for their confidence and sense of independence.

We had another successful visit from the Life Education Van over the last fortnight and the kids were taught some important concepts covering the topics of food and nutrition, personal safety, physical activity, cyber safety, medicines, tobacco, alcohol and caffeine, depending on their year level. The visiting educator ensured that all messages were age-appropriate, relevant and align with key learning objectives for our school. Students weren't told what decisions to make during these sessions – but played an active role with their class to build the skills required to make safe and healthy decisions on their own. Please ask your student what they learnt during these sessions if you haven't already. Discussions and follow-up at home are important for embedding new understandings and building the home/school learning relationship.





On Thursday we had half our grades participate in Yoga and Mindfulness workshops conducted by Charli from Cloud Nine. These complimentary sessions were a great opportunity for the students involved to learn yoga poses, build flexibility and engage in calming techniques.

On Friday, all of our Prep, Grade 2 and Grade 4 students will be participating in a Responsible Pet Ownership Incursion at school. This free program is a government funded initiative and is designed to give children a greater appreciation of pets and animals and the important role they play in many families. They learn about pet behaviour and body language and whether an animal is relaxed or uncomfortable in a range of situations, helping kids to remain safe around animals. The session is run by a fully qualified presenter who will also be bringing along their dog to help demonstrate and support the concepts being taught on the day.

Friday evening also sees our Latin Night take place. All our preparations are nearly complete and we're confident this is going to be one of the highlights of the school year for families. Hector's band have been rehearsing some classic Latin songs, the catering staff have been working around the clock and our events committee have planned every last detail. All we need now is for you to come along and join in the fun!! The weather forecast looks great, with some warm and sunny spring conditions on the day. Tickets will be available at the door, and food, drinks and raffle tickets can be purchased during the evening. Please come along any time between 5:30pm – 8:00pm and support the school in this major fundraising event.

Finally, a reminder to any parents who received an invitation to participate in the Parent Survey, to please complete this by Monday 27<sup>th</sup> August. We value your feedback and will use the information collected to plan curriculum and programs for the school.
