<u>'Immunisation Certificates- Important Information'</u> I am seeking your co-operation in ensuring we have a record of your child's immunisation status on file. Please be aware that if we do not have a copy of your child's immunisation certificate then your child may be excluded from attending school for up to 14 days, if there is an outbreak of measles in the school community.</u>

Reminder letters regarding immunisation certificates have been posted home. If you receive a reminder, please bring your child/children's immunisation certificate into the office **as soon as possible**.

CSEF- CAMPS, SPORTS & EXCURSIONS FUND 2017- IMPORTANT INFORMATION

CSEF will be provided by the Victorian Government to assist eligible families to cover the costs of school trips, camps and sporting activities. If you hold a <u>valid</u> means tested concession card or are a temporary foster parent, you **may** be eligible for CSEF. A special consideration category also exists for asylum seeker and refugee families. The allowance is paid directly to the school to use towards expenses relating to camps, excursions or sporting activities that benefit the child. The annual CSEF amount **per student is \$125** for primary school students. If you are eligible for CSEF then you need to apply every year. *Even if you received CSEF in 2016.* Application forms were sent home last week. **Completed Application Forms need to be returned to the school with proof of a current concession card.**

We need to see wy your Concession Card and photocopy it, so please bring this with you.

(Some parents have just sent the form and unfortunately we cannot proceed with the application without seeing your valid concession card) You are encouraged to lodge the application form as soon as possible. The Closing Date for applications is June 30th 2017. Extra forms are available from the front office.


