

Lost Items

Occasionally children lose valuable items and toys at school. There are times when children may accidently bring home something that does not belong to them. This can also include pieces of uniform such as windcheaters. If you notice an item at home that does not belong to your child, can you please just return this to school. Last week a child lost their purple Fitbit and even after an extensive search, we couldn't find it. While every care is taken to look after children's belongings, I recommend that children <u>do not</u> bring valuable items to school.

Education Sub-Committee Meeting - 9th May 3:45pm

Parents are invited to attend the Education Sub-Committee Meeting that will be held on Wednesday 9th May. This committee will review and rewrite current school policies. Debbie is looking forward to meeting with parents in the Staffroom at 3.45pm. It is expected that this meeting will run for approximately forty-five minutes. No special skills are required, just an interest in improving our school processes.

Student Behaviour at School

We aim to set high standards for student behaviour at school. Our goal is to work in conjunction with families to achieve the best outcomes for all students. Sometimes children will encounter conflicts with other children at school, but this can be quite different to bullying. What is bullying? Bullying is when people repeatedly and intentionally use words or actions against someone or a group of people to cause distress and risk to their wellbeing. These actions are usually done by people who have more influence or power over someone else, or who want to make someone else feel less powerful or helpless. It can be very upsetting if your child is being bullied and we would like to work with you to identify a solution. Sometimes, we are not told that there is a problem with student behaviour. We take a **zero tolerance approach to bullying**, but **you need to let us know if there is a problem**. If you are ever concerned about bullying at school, please let your child's teacher know straight away. Recently we have had quite a few incidents involving children swearing in the yard. To discourage this behaviour, we will be giving short, in-school detentions for any children heard swearing. I would appreciate all families talking to their children about speaking politely and behaving appropriately at school.

Thank you

A huge thank you to all of the parents and brothers and sisters who have been waiting at the front of the school to collect students.

We often have parents who arrive early and wait to pick their children up at 3.30pm. I have asked that if you arrive prior to the bell to collect children that you wait on the seats near the Prep Area and not inside the school building. This also includes secondary students who may be picking up brothers and sisters. During a school day, we ask that all visitors report to the office and receive a Visitor's Badge. At the end of the day it is not necessary to collect a Visitor's Badge, but in order to keep all of our children safe we respectfully request that all visitors including parents wait on the seats near the Prep Area. Students exiting the school are asked to use the door closest to their Unit and not come through the front office area (unless collecting a mobile phone), as it tends to become very congested. Once their teacher has dismissed children, they will walk around to the seats in the Prep Area and meet you there.


Anglicare Parent Program 'GROWING GREAT KIDS'

Unit C


