## <u>Unit B</u>

### Musical

Grade 6 students are continuing to progress well during rehearsals. Most students have memorised all their lines and are able to perform without the assistance of a script. It is still expected that students practise their lines at home each night, saying them out loud, working on projection, pronunciation and tempo. At times students can still speak a little quickly making it hard for the audience to understand what is being said. We appreciate your help preparing your child for the performances which are creeping up very fast.

Grade 5 students are looking forward to their new areas of study for this term. In Economics, after learning about Needs and Wants, Producers and Consumers and Consumer Rights and Responsibilities in Term 2, the students will now put their knowledge into practice. They will create an advertising campaign for the Grade 6 musical and make a specific product for sale before the production begins.

The Primary Science program at Lyndale Secondary College began for 5B this week with experiments involving the creation and observation of chemical reactions. Mrs Brighton's class will have more lessons over the next three weeks and Mrs Ford's class will begin their lessons on August 21<sup>st</sup>.

Grade 5B used a writing rake to explore their reactions to the cold winter mornings during the holidays. They then created a short piece of writing focusing on vocabulary, similes and metaphor.
