This piece of play equipment will be installed at the front of the school in front of the art room. Any money raised from the Walkathon that was held today will go towards the Pirate Ship, so we are hoping that families will be very generous. Updating School Facilities

At Rosewood Downs, we aim to continually improve the facilities and equipment so that our students and staff have a great environment to learn and work in. We are pleased to announce that our next big project will involve the refurbishment of the children's toilets. This work will begin in the coming weeks. The toilets in Units A and B will be the first toilet blocks to be refurbished. The refurbishment will include new flooring, painting, new partitions and doors, new taps, lighting and hand dryers. I would like to thank Mr Growcott who has been responsible for organising this large project. We are hoping that by the end of the year, all of the toilet blocks including the staff toilets will have been upgraded.

In addition, we will be installing new cabinets & benches in the Sick Bay. We are also in the process of purchasing a large amount of student furniture including tables and chairs. This furniture will be delivered early next term.

Slapped Cheek- 'one case confirmed'

In accordance with directions from the Department of Education, parents are advised that a case of "Slapped Cheek" infection has been confirmed in a child attending the school. "Slapped Cheek" is a 'mild, self-limiting infection' - those who are infected are most contagious before the onset of the rash. This disease is characterised by bright red cheeks, a cold like illness and sometimes an itchy rash on the torso and limbs. Some members of our community will need to contact their doctor if they are immune suppressed, have chronic haemolytic disorders or are pregnant. Please understand that this is a precautionary warning.



Staff Car Park

Recently, we have had several parents parking in the Staff Car Park. Please remember that parents and visitors are not allowed to park in the staff car park at any time. We understand that it is sometimes difficult to get a park in the street, but the staff car park is strictly reserved for staff. It's also unsafe for parents and students to walk through the car park.


You are INVITED to come along on Monday 26th June as our students showcase their learning. Pieta will lead each grade level in one of the dances they have learnt.

School Banking

Get involved in the School Banking program.

ROSEWOOD DOWNS is excited to offer the Commonwealth Bank School Banking program to all students.

School Banking is a fun, interactive and engaging way for young Australians to learn about money and develop good savings habits. Children who deposit money into their Youthsaver account through School Banking earn Dollarmites tokens, which they can save up and redeem for exciting rewards.

School Banking is also a great fundraiser for our school. Our school receives \$5 when a student makes their first ever School Banking deposit and 5% on every deposit made through the school (to a maximum of \$10 per individual deposit).

Getting involved in School Banking is easy!

All you need to get involved in the School Banking program is a Commonwealth Bank Youthsaver account. You can open an account for your child in one of two ways:

1. Online

Visit commbank.com.au/schoolbanking and click on the link to open a Youthsaver account.

2. In branch

Visit a Commonwealth Bank branch with identification for yourself and your child, like a driver's licence and birth certificate.

If your child has an existing Commonwealth Bank Youthsaver account they can start banking straight away. They just need to bring their deposit in every week on School Banking day using their Dollarmites deposit wallet.

Does your brother or sister have a Commonwealth Banking Youthsaver account?

If so, did you know that you can bring it to school, along with yours, every Wednesday and we can process their deposit into their account as well!

So if your big brother or sister has left our school, or hasn't started yet, they don't have to miss out. Simply bring all bank books to school on Wednesday and we will process for you. It's that easy. :)
