### NAPLAN Breakfast Club

We held the first two sessions of our NAPLAN Breakfast Club on Wednesday and Thursday this week. We were very pleased to see lots of Grade 3 and 5 students turn up at 8am to work with Mrs Lucas and myself on some practice activities in the lead up to NAPLAN testing in Week 4 of term. NAPLAN (National Assessment Program – Literacy and Numeracy) is a range of five literacy and numeracy tests that are conducted Australia-wide for all students in Grades 3, 5, 7 and 9. Our Breakfast Club sessions help

students to become familiar with the testing format and hopefully helps to ease the anxiety that some children experience when participating in formal testing situations. We have three more sessions on Friday 3<sup>rd</sup>, Monday 6<sup>th</sup> and Tuesday 7<sup>th</sup> and we invite all Grade 3 and 5 students to participate in any of these sessions if they would like to join in.

### **SPEAK EASY with Marcelle Bernard**

Our Grade 3-6 students were very lucky to participate in an incursion on Wednesday featuring Marcelle Bernard who delivered a very engaging and enjoyable presentation on building confidence for public speaking. Marcelle spoke to the students about the tools, rules and weapons of confident communication. Our students enjoyed a lively and interactive session and left inspired and excited, with skills that they can use immediately in school, in later study and both socially and professionally throughout their lives. She taught our kids that with practise, we can overcome nerves, gain a positive attitude and become more confident. We hope to see the benefits of Marcelle's presentation when our students are given public speaking opportunities at our assemblies and within their classrooms.

Many of our students in Units B and C are getting very excited about our school camps which are taking place on Wednesday, Thursday and Friday next week.
