### **Communicating with School Staff**

At Rosewood Downs, we strive to provide learning programs and make decisions in the best interests of all students, based on current research and our experience in the education system. We appreciate the trust that families show in us to make decisions on your behalf in regard to your most prized possessions: your children. We understand that parents and carers choose Rosewood Downs for a range of reasons; our reputation, our community feel, our results, our students, our outstanding staff, our curriculum programs and our extra-curricular activities amongst other things. The benefit of the Government education system is that you get to choose the school that is best for your child. Once this difficult decision is finalised and a commitment is made, then it is important to place trust in the school and teachers to make ongoing decisions in the best interest of all the children in our care. We all do our best to make decisions based on the information before us, using our knowledge and experience specific to our profession, in the best interests of all, whilst being mindful of each individual child.

Sometimes, decisions are well received, sometimes they aren't particularly popular, and sometimes we have parents questioning decisions that are made. At RDPS, we invite feedback, whether positive or negative, and we are dedicated to continuous improvement. We value open communication with our families and are committed to understanding concerns and addressing them appropriately. We value and encourage open and positive relationships with our school community with the understanding that a strong home/school partnership makes a very significant difference to a child's attitude to school and academic outcomes. We try very hard to communicate with clarity and regularity with our families, and Compass has been very successful in helping to achieve this. We welcome parent communication with teachers, but insist that this communication be respectful and conducted at appropriate times and places

to ensure teachers are able to maintain their focus on their core business of teaching your child, along with all of the other children in their care.

With this in mind, I encourage you to look at three important policy documents that are included with this newsletter which help to ensure that all parent communication with the school remains constructive, productive and leads to positive outcomes. *Teachers are generally available after school for brief, informal conversations*, but if you would like to arrange a more formal meeting, please refer to and follow the protocols and processes as outlined in the three policies. These three policies, which are attached along with the newsletter are;

- Parent code of conduct
- · Communicating with school staff
- Complaints policy

One of our school's key priorities is to work positively together with families to support every student at Rosewood Downs to experience success. Following the guidelines set out in the policies above will help to ensure working relationships throughout the school community are trusting, affirming and effective.

### We want some student feedback!

We value student voice as a means to improving student engagement, wellbeing and quality instruction and are conducting a survey to find out what your child thinks of our school. The Attitudes to School Survey is an annual student survey offered by the Department of Education and Training to assist schools in gaining an understanding of students' perceptions and experience of school. Our school will use the survey results to plan programs and activities to improve your child's schooling experience. Students in Grades 4 to 6 will participate in the survey. Your child will complete the survey online during school hours via the secure online survey tool. It is important to note that we are not in any way 'testing' your child. Students have the right to refuse or withdraw from the survey at any point before, during, or after completion of the survey. Your child will be provided with a unique login to complete the survey. The student login is an assigned identifier that may be used to link data for statistical and research purposes only. All responses to the survey are kept anonymous in the response file. Personal identification data will not be recorded in the survey response file. This ensures that the confidentiality of your child's responses is protected at all times. The Attitudes to School survey will be conducted at our school over the next two weeks. The survey takes about 15 minutes to complete and occurs during your child's class time. The survey results will be reported back to the school once we gain access to the data.


