Citrus fruits and citrus fruit peels are not a good choice for feeding our composting worms. Do you want to know why? It's because the fruit of citrus trees is highly acidic, and this acid is irritating to our red composting worms as it breaks down in the soil.

Next week, some of the Green Team members will run a short workshop in the Unit C garden at lunchtime for any students interested in seeing our red wigglers in action. Who knows, students might be chosen to use the compost aerator to mix our organic waste!

We also started our first open-air 'Green Library' this week where Green Team members welcomed students at lunchtime to sit down and enjoy environmental picture books. We recently started building our collection of books which includes gardening books, how to reduce plastic use and recycling art just to name a few and we hope to add more inspiring books to our library next year.
