The countdown is officially on with only 10 days of school left for 2020! We're packing in lots of action for our last few weeks of school and have lots of activities for the students over coming weeks.

We got some very good news this week, with notifications that our school will be the recipient of a minor capital works grant and a prize from the Victorian School Garden Awards. We applied for a grant earlier this year seeking funds to install a new playground behind the adventure playground. I got a call from our Local Member, Gabrielle Williams' office to notify me we were successful and will receive over \$50,000 to install and new playground in the vacant playground area at the rear of the school. This is a fantastic result and will be another upgrade that all our students will benefit from. In addition to this, we also entered our upgraded school gardens into the 2020 Victorian School Garden Awards and we took home the 'Anco School Turf Award' which means we are the recipients of 300m² of Kikuyu Turf. You can never have enough green grass in a school! We plan to have this grass laid in the gravel area between Unit C and the oval which could do with some greening up. Hopefully, both the grass and playground will be installed during Term 1 next year.

One of the highlights of next week will be the *Up Program* which will be taking place on the mornings of Tuesday 8th, Wednesday 9th and Thursday 10<sup>th</sup> of December. The *Up Program* provides the opportunity for students to meet their 2020 class teacher and participate in some fun, getting-to-know-you activities with their new classmates. This program is really important to help students become familiar with the changes that will take place as they move up a year level and meet new teachers and classmates. Grade and teacher placements will be sent home with students after the first session on Tuesday. We ask you to support your child's transition to the next year level by being positive about the move to a new teacher, classroom space or unit. We are very lucky that our students work in open-plan classroom spaces, which means they have support from a range of staff and can develop connections with more than one teacher. Students also have the ability to mix with all of the children within the whole unit.

Another big event on the cards for next week is *Grade 6 Graduation*. Once again, like many events this year, graduation has been modified to ensure it is COVID-safe, but we have a fun and memorable evening planned for our senior students to give them a fitting send-off from Rosewood Downs. There will be a special dinner, graduation ceremony and disco. It's always a very memorable night for our Grade 6 students and comes at the end of seven years of schooling at Rosewood Downs PS for most of the students. It provides a great opportunity to reflect on their time at primary school as they prepare to embark on their journey to secondary school.
