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Welcome Back

Once again, a warm welcome back to school to all our families. I have really enjoyed seeing our students slot back into school routines with big smiles and a real sense of enthusiasm about what the school year ahead has in store. I'd also like to thank the parents who assisted with book collection and second hand uniform sales before school started and during this week. The school appreciates the ongoing support of the many people who contribute to the successful operation of Rosewood Downs.

Welcome Picnic

To celebrate our return to school and to formally welcome our new families and students, we are holding our annual 'Welcome Picnic' on Thursday evening, 11th February, 5:00pm – 6:30pm. We cordially invite all families to this picnic which will provide the opportunity to meet our teachers and to mingle with other families in the school. It's been nearly 12 months since our last event where we're able to invite parents, so we're really hoping for a good turnout. Road and Student Safety

With the return to school comes the return of fairly hectic traffic on Murray Road during drop-off and pick-up times. Unsafe and impatient driving leads to frustration and inconvenience for others and affects neighbouring residents on our street. Please show courtesy and patience during peak traffic times at school, especially in the afternoons, as dangerous and illegal driving and parking poses a very significant risk to the safety of our students. There have already been council traffic officers on the street in the morning and afternoon, observing traffic flow and issuing warnings. Another safety concern for the school is the use of the staff car park as a pedestrian thoroughfare in the morning and afternoons. I would request that parents and students don't use the carpark to enter and leave the school grounds. We have several other paths and gateways around the school providing safe access in and out of our grounds, but the staff car park experiences regular traffic use throughout the day and poses a serious safety risk to people walking through.

CSEF - Camps, Sports & Excursions Fund 2021

CSEF will be provided by the Victorian Government to assist eligible families to cover the costs of school trips, camps and sporting activities. If you hold a valid means tested concession card or are a temporary foster parent, you may be eligible for CSEF. A special consideration category also exists for asylum seeker and refugee families. The allowance is paid directly to the school to use towards expenses relating to camps, excursions or sporting activities that benefit the child. The annual CSEF amount per student is \$125 for primary school students.

Schools are able to accept and process applications up until the end of term two each year. CSEF payments are made to schools from March onwards each year. Student Accident Insurance and Ambulance Cover

It is a requirement at the start of each year that we advise parents that children are not covered by any accident insurance or ambulance cover whilst at school unless these are taken out privately by parents. Unfortunately, injuries do occur from time to time at school, so if parents wish to insure against this, private cover can be taken out through private insurance companies, as can private Ambulance cover through Ambulance Victoria.
