Dear Parents and Caregivers,

Rosewood Downs Primary School is looking forward to another great year of teaching and learning and would like to advise you of our voluntary financial contributions for 2026. Please find the fee schedule for Grade 5 and 6 **2026** attached. In 2025 we were graded *High* in our annual report based on student academic performance and wellbeing. In order to maintain this level of success for your students we have put together the following parent payments meticulously.

Schools provide students with free instruction to fulfil the standard curriculum requirements, and we want to assure you that all contributions are voluntary. Nevertheless, the ongoing support of our families ensures that our school can offer the best possible education and support for our students. We want to thank you for all your support. This has made a huge difference to our school and the programs we can offer. This year we received north of 90% contributions and this money was integral to allowing our students to receive equitable learning opportunities.

Within our school this support has allowed us to begin to build our reputation as a school that is on the forefront of best practice. This was made evident in 2025 by the significant number of schools that came to see our work as well as being featured at the Victorian Principals Conference. In line with the recent initiatives from the deputy premier Ben Carrol we are a school that puts a heavy emphasis on research and the science of learning. We use an explicit instruction pedagogy that requires significant financial resources to ensure students have whiteboards and whiteboard markers that are used in every single lesson so that our teachers can ensure that every single student is demonstrating their understanding. Our literature rich curriculum also requires students to have individual booklets for all of their novel study work. These booklets require a huge amount of printing at the cost of the school. This money also goes towards expanding opportunities for our students to ensure they are receiving a well-rounded education. We will be expanding our science program again next year, science is an extremely important subject and one that builds knowledge integral to high school success. With a strong science program comes experiments that once again require significant resourcing for experiments and practice.

As in previous years, we have arranged the day prior to the start of school for parents to make their voluntary financial contribution and student book pack payments. This will take place on **Tuesday 27^h January** between **8:45am – 4:00pm**.

Rosewood Downs continues to welcome your voluntary contributions to support our school.

Plans for 2026 include redeveloping our oval to be a place that students love to play. In 2025 your contributions helped to reseed the oval and purchase soccer nets for it. We are also beginning to slowly build savings to find a replacement for the adventure playground that was unfortunately shut down due to safety in 2024. The school strives to continually improve and upgrade all facilities available for our students to ensure that we provide the best spaces possible for your children to learn and play. A new playground would cost roughly \$150k, we will be keeping a visual tally of progress in the hall.

<p>New Playground Project: Following a safety assessment audit in 2024, our school playground was required to be dismantled due to significant wear and tear. While this was a necessary step to ensure the continued safety of our students, it has left an important gap in the outdoor play and recreational opportunities available to them. The school is now committed to developing a new, modern, and inclusive playground that will provide a safe and stimulating environment for all students to enjoy for many years to come. To assist with the funding of this project, we are inviting voluntary contributions from our parent community. As a guideline, we are suggesting a contribution of \$100 per family; however, any amount you are able to contribute will make a meaningful difference. Your support will directly enhance the learning and wellbeing of our students by helping to create a vibrant and engaging space that promotes active play, creativity, and social connection.</p>	\$100

FREE INSTRUCTION

- Schools provide students with free instruction and ensure students have free access to all items, activities and services that are used by the school to fulfil the requirements of the Curriculum. This includes the Victorian Curriculum F-10, the Victorian Certificate of Education (VCE) including the VCE Vocational Major and the Victorian Pathways Certificate.
- Schools may invite parents to make a financial contribution to support the school.



PARENT PAYMENT REQUESTS

Schools can request contributions from parents under three categories:

Curriculum Contributions

Voluntary financial contributions for curriculum items and activities which the school deems necessary for students to learn the Curriculum.

Other Contributions

Voluntary financial contributions for non-curriculum items and activities that relate to the school's functions and objectives.

Extra-Curricular Items and Activities

Items and activities that enhance or broaden the schooling experience of students and are above and beyond what the school provides for free to deliver the Curriculum. These are provided on a user-pays basis.

- Schools may also invite parents to supply or purchase educational items to use and own (e.g. textbooks, stationery, digital devices).



FINANCIAL HELP FOR FAMILIES

- Schools put in place financial hardship arrangements to support families who cannot pay for items or activities so that their child doesn't miss out.
- Schools have a nominated parent payment contact person(s) that parents can have a confidential discussion with regarding financial hardship arrangements.



SCHOOL PROCESSES
