By analysing our progress, we are then able to set new four-year targets and write a new Strategic Plan.

# Absences - Please contact the School

school regarding absences on the day of the absence. This term we are introducing a new roll marking system called Compass. If your child is absent and we have not received notification from you by 9:45am, then you will receive a reminder SMS to contact the school. Each week, I am following up unexplained absences with a phone call. It is a requirement of the Education Department that we can account for all absences. We are aiming for all children to be at school unless they are unwell.


