## CSEF- CAMPS, SPORTS & EXCURSIONS FUND 2017- IMPORTANT INFORMATION

CSEF will be provided by the Victorian Government to assist eligible families to cover the costs of school trips, camps and sporting activities. If you hold a valid means tested concession card or are a temporary foster parent, you may be eligible for CSEF. A special consideration category also exists for asylum seeker and refugee families. The allowance is paid directly to the school to use towards expenses relating to camps, excursions or sporting activities that benefit the child. The annual CSEF amount per student is \$125 for primary school students. If you are eligible for CSEF then you need to apply every year. *(Even if you received CSEF in 2016)* Application forms were sent home last week. Completed Application Forms need to be returned to the school with proof of a current concession card. *(Some parents have just sent the form and unfortunately we cannot proceed with the application without seeing your valid concession card)* You are encouraged to lodge the application form as soon as possible. The Closing Date for applications is June 30<sup>th</sup> 2017. Extra forms are available from the front office.

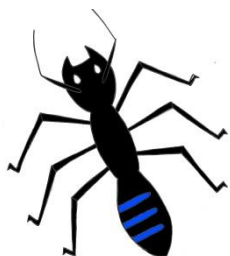
**Where:** Tirhatuan Park (Kriegel Way)
